

Updates To Auckland Transport Fares



Free travel for 5 to 12 year olds and half-price travel for 13 to 24 year olds on AT bus, train and ferry services will end on 30 April 2024, in line with the government's decision to withdraw funding for these concessions.

This means that from Wednesday 1 May:

5 to 12 year olds will no longer travel for free on weekdays and will instead pay a child concession (at least 40% off adult fares). They will continue to travel for free on weekends. The child concession will apply to anyone aged 5 to 15, who has a registered AT HOP card with their correct date of birth.

13 to 15 year olds will stop receiving the half-price child fares discount and instead switch to paying full child fares (at least 40% off an adult fare during weekdays, and free travel on weekends) from 1 May. The child concession will apply to anyone aged 5 to 15, who has a registered AT HOP card with their correct date of birth.

16 to 19 year olds with a secondary student concession will stop receiving the half-price secondary fares discount and instead switch to paying full secondary fares (at least 40% off an adult fare). Students aged 16-19 should apply for the secondary student concession to ensure they are paying the cheapest fare possible. PLEASE WRITE THE STUDENTS NAME ON THEIR AT HOP CARDS - THE OFFICE HAS A LARGE NUMBER OF AT HOP CARDS THAT HAVE BEEN HANDED IN, BUT WITH NO NAMES ON THEM WE CANNOT IDENTIFY WHO THEY BELONG TO.

School Immunisations

Year 7 students will be offered the **Boostrix** vaccine (Tdap) in school. This vaccine is a booster of tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (pertussis). Most children received these immunisations last as preschoolers. This is scheduled for August, with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day. Consent forms will be given out later this year.

Year 8 students will be offered the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in school. This New Zealand scheduled vaccine is recommended to be given at 12 years of age. Students need two doses with a 6-month gap between dose 1 and 2. This is scheduled for early May 2024 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day. Consent forms have been sent home with your child. For more information on this important programme or to access an electronic consent form, please go to School Immunisations.

Enviroclass- Saddleback Reserve

Last week, students from **Room 33 Enviroclass** continued the removal of invasive plants in Saddleback Reserve. Saddleback Reserve is a beautiful forest reserve just a few minutes walk from our school. This is an ongoing project that was started by last year's Enviroclass.

Removing invasive species is a key factor in restoring our native forest by allowing native species to grow and thrive. It is also a great way to learn about the negative impacts that pests can have on our ecosystems.

We will continue our work at Saddleback Reserve throughout the year with the hopes that over time we can return the reserve to beautiful native bush.

You may have noticed students in front of our school on Thursday morning holding up signs for drivers. These were students from our Travelwise Team. We were reminding drivers to slow down, pay attention, and be mindful of students. Thank you for the smiles, waves and honks - we got to one hundred!


Henry wants to make a rectangular chicken run at the back of the house.
